Short-Term Program Classes

Texas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired

Late August to May

School year short-term program classes are designed to provide Expanded Core Curriculum support for academic level students who are functioning at or close to grade level. There is no cost to districts or families. Please go to our website for specific information about the classes and how to apply.



Monday-to-Friday Classes. Highly intensive classes focus on compensatory skills needed by learners with visual impairments to access the regular curriculum. Typical ratios are a teacher and TA with two or three students working on similar objectives. Students' local teachers select their student's objectives through discussion with TSBVI teachers. Popular topics are technology, maximizing use of low vision, and math or science tools and concepts. Students in all classes also receive training in social, self-determination, and independent living skills after school in the dorm.



Elementary Technology, Math, Series: Tech Tools or Math Masters. Students in grades 2-5, who are non-visual learners, attend a series of three 3-day fall classes at TSBVI to learn basic technology skills, compensatory math or compensatory literacy skills. Local TVIs and TSBVI work together between sessions to assure continuity of learning. Accepted students must commit to attend all three sections of the class. No exceptions!!



Extended Weekend Classes. Classes focus on skills needed by learners with visual impairments, which may be difficult to address in the regular academic day. Topics include: low vision tools and strategies, mobility, independent living, recreation/leisure, personal and interpersonal growth, pre-driving skills with low vision, self-advocacy, and others. The ability to learn alongside other visually impaired students and adults can be a life changing opportunity that enhances self-esteem and leads to greater motivation in approaching life's personal and academic challenges.



Distance Learning Classes. Distance Learning online courses are interactive learning experiences for students who are blind or have visual impairments. Students take the class, using a computer, in their local community. Courses may be self-paced, real-time with an instructor, or a combination of self-paced and real-time instruction. This instruction can be presented to groups or to individuals through video conferencing software.

Referrals to Short-Term Program classes must come from the local school district. Students may attend more than one class. Parents can learn more by contacting their child's local teacher of students with visual impairments, or by calling the director of the TSBVI Short-Term Programs (contact information below).
