

CRIMINAL HISTORY AUTHORIZATION FORM

This form is not considered as part of the application for employment. It will be separated from the application.

Texas Government Code 411.098 authorizes a school district to obtain the criminal history record of every applicant for employment or volunteer services with the district.

In accordance with the provisions of Senate Bill 9 of the 80th Legislature, all individuals who are offered employment on or after January 1, 2008 will undergo a national criminal history information check based on fingerprints submitted to the Department of Public Safety. TSBVI will pay for this process, and persons who are offered employment but do not complete the process or do not have an acceptable criminal history will not be employed or will be discharged if they have begun working.

Therefore, as a part of your application process, you must provide the following information.

Ethnic Origin Information

Ethnic Origin (please check one)

White – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East or North Africa.

Black – a persons having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa

Hispanic – a person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Asian – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Kapan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

American Indian or Alaskan Native – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander – a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

Two or More Races – a person who primarily identifies with two or more of the above race/ethnicity categories.
