

**Narrator:** Access classes give students around the state opportunities to learn skills that will help them access their core curriculum in the home district school environment. Examples include technology, such as screen readers or braille displays; math, including abacus and tactile graphing; and low vision tools and strategies, to name a few. Short-Term Programs staff and Teachers of Students with Visual Impairments collaborate to set student goals for their time on campus. Students receive academic instruction through various formats: some attend in-person classes lasting up to a week, which may include hands-on activities in the campus Maker Space and off-campus field trips, while others participate remotely via weekly or biweekly Zoom sessions.
